### The City of Inglewood A True Energy Leader

The City of Inglewood received a check in the amount of \$18,366.76 as part of the South Bay Cities Council of Governments/Southern California Edison Energy Leader Partnership Program at the City Council meeting on Tuesday, March 1, 2011. Inglewood, Manhattan Beach and Hawthorne have all received checks. Your city could be next!

Through the Energy Leader Partnership Program, Southern California Edison and South Bay City Councils of Governments / South Bay Environmental Services Center provide support to local governments to identify and address energy efficiency opportunities in municipal facilities, take actions supporting the California Long Term Energy Efficiency Strategic Plan, and increase community awareness and participation in demand side management opportunities.

There are four participation levels within this program:

- Valued Partner
- Silver
- Gold
- Platinum

Cities receive incentive amounts based on the level they have achieved. Demand Response (DR), a component of the Energy Leader Partnership Program, provides participating cities bill reductions, energy credits or both by reducing energy demand when requested by SCE.
